ANNUAL MARY DURACK MEMORIAL LECTURE, SUNDAY July 21, 2.30pm

Amanda Curtin, author of 'Kathleen O'Connor of Paris' – who was a daughter of noted engineer CY O'Connor will explore the persistence and influence of Kate's Irish heritage on her extraordinary life and career. Kathleen (Kate) O'Connor, was a fearless, determined woman who flouted the conventions and expectations of her time to pursue a career in art. She became an acclaimed impressionist artist, exhibiting for six decades, and her work is now held in the national galleries of Australia and New Zealand, every state gallery, and major art collections such as those of The University of Western Australia, Wesfarmers, Janet Holmes à Court, Kerry Stokes and the City of Fremantle.

Although Kate was born in New Zealand, came of age in Western Australia, and lived and worked for most of her life in Paris, she identified herself throughout as being 'Irish in mind and spirit'.

Amanda is author of novels Elemental (2013) and The Sinkings (2008), and short story collection Inherited (2011). Elemental was shortlisted for the Western Australian Premier's Book Awards, and in 2016 was published in the UK
