Member participation invited to Saint Brigid's Festival, Sunday 30 Jan 2022

Torc Ceili Club are holding a festival at Kidogo Arthouse, Fremantle on the 28th & 30th January 2022. This festival will be a weekend of creativity celebrated through music, dance, art and food. The festival's activities will mostly be interactive with the aim of bringing people together to acknowledge the culture and history of St Brigid while celebrating the creativity of our local artists.

The Friday session of the festival will include a sit-down meal of food representative of the Imbolc season. It will be an evening of entertainment including song, dance, poetry and a display of art, all from local creatives.

The Sunday session will focus on family friendly activities. There will be an Irish Céilí, which is a selection of traditional Irish dances in groups of people. These are simple dances that are suitable for people with no previous dance experience and they are heaps of fun. There will be the best of Perth's traditional musicians providing toe tapping tunes!

There will also be a program of various arts and crafts activities during the festival. There will be making of St Brigid crosses and Bridog Dolls from straw to symbolise both the spring harvest and St. Brigid. These arts and crafts activities will be suitable for all ages.

The aim of this project is to bring people together. Whether these people are dancing, singing, playing music, listening to poetry or stories, creating handmade pieces of art or just sitting back and observing all of the activities we want to bring people together and honour a woman that is a representative of Ireland's culture and history through so many different creative outlets. It will be an education through multiple mediums that are suitable for people of all ages and backgrounds.
