Wed Feb 2: 48 ANGELS, 90m, 2007, Drama

Seamus is a 9 year old boy who has been diagnosed with a serious illness. In search of a miracle, he sets off to find God before God comes for him. Inspired by Saint Columcille, Seamus sets out in a small boat without oars or sail. On his quest he encounters James, a traumatized adolescent and Darry mid thirties, a Protestant hard liner who is finding it difficult to come to terms with the new political thinking in Northern Ireland. Despite initial conflict, the trio decide to stay together and enter upon a journey that results in the healing of hearts and minds. Filmed in Donegal.

Wed Feb 9: THREE SUMMERS, 98m, 2017, Romantic Comedy

Over three consecutive years, two musicians, Irish pretentious theremin player Roland (Robert Sheehan from Portlaoise) and down-to-earth pub band fiddler Keevy (Rebecca Breeds) meet and fall in love at the festival amidst a microcosm of Australian society. The film has a large ensemble cast including Magda Szubanski, Michael Caton, Deborah Mailman, Jacqueline McKenzie and John Waters. Written and directed by Ben Elton and filmed in Fairbridge WA

Wed Feb 23: THE WIND THAT SHAKES THE BARLEY, 126m, 1996 Drama/War

Directed by Ken Loach, set during the Irish War of Independence (1919–1921) and the Irish Civil War (1922–1923). Two brothers fight side-by-side against the British forces for Ireland's independence. When a treaty is negotiated, civil war erupts and the brothers find themselves on opposing sides. The film won the Palme d'Or at the 2006 Cannes Film Festival. Filming locations in County Cork include Ballyvourney, Timoleague, Bandon, and Coolea, and Kilmainham Gaol in Dublin. Stars Cillian Murphy

Fred Daly (Colm Meaney) returns to Ireland with nowhere to live but his car. Then dope-smoking 21-year-old Cathal (Colin Morgan) parks beside him and brightens up his lonely world.
